2. Requirements

Applicants must have a nationality other than Japanese, and must satisfy one or more of the following conditions.

- (1) Have completed a school education of 12 years outside of Japan (including those who are expecting to do so no later than March 31, 2020), or the equivalent as designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology.
- (2) Have been recognized by Hijiyama University to have equivalent or higher academic ability as applicants who have graduated from high school (including those who have acquired International Baccalaureate, Abitur, Baccalauré at, or GCE A Level certification) and will have turned 18 years old as of April 1, 2020.
- (3) International students are required to have a high proficiency level in the Japanese language, such as N2 on the Japanese-Language Proficiency Test or 200 points or more (not including the writing section) on the Examination for Japanese University Admission for International Students (EJU), administered by JASSO (the Japan Student Services Organization), because almost all lectures and seminars are conducted in Japanese.
 - * Applicants who apply to the Department of Child Development & Education, Faculty of Contemporary Culture, are required to have a high proficiency level in the Japanese language, such as N2 on the Japanese-Language Proficiency Test or 250 points or more (not including the writing section) on the Examination for Japanese University Admission for International Students (EJU), administered by JASSO (the Japan Student Service Organization), because almost all lectures and seminars are conducted in Japanese.
 - ◆ Applicants need to have an interview prior to submitting an application form. For details, please contact the Admissions Office.
 - ◆ Applicants need to be able to obtain or renew visa status as a student of Hijiyama University as determined by the Immigration Control and Refugee Recognition Act.
